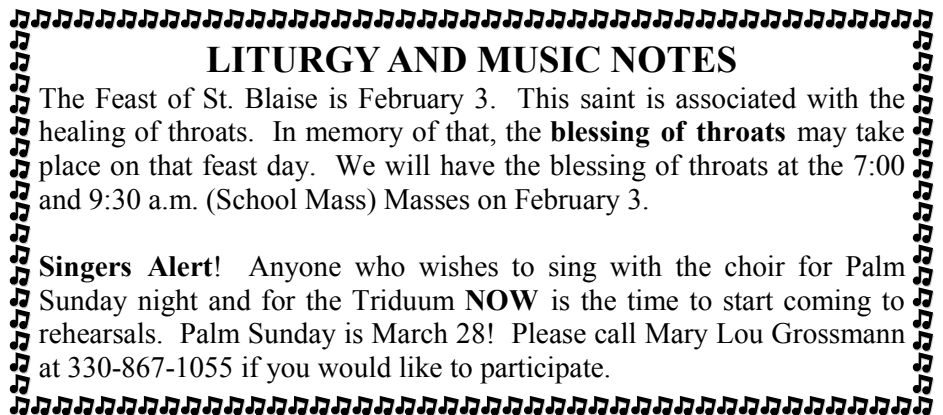
AMERICAN RED CROSS BLOOD DRIVE

Jeremiah 1: 4-5, 17-19

I Cor 12:31-13:13

Luke 4: 21-30

REFLECTING ON THE SCRIPTURES

Two of today’s readings give us a close-up look at the hazards of the prophet’s life. The first reading is God’s pep talk to Jeremiah acknowledging the opposition Jeremiah would encounter, but promising God’s protection. In the gospel, Jesus moves from “hometown hero” to an object of anger and violence in the blink of an eye. Why the sudden change? His listeners were enraged by his prophetic challenge. At baptism we are anointed to share in the three-fold ministry of Jesus— priest, prophet and king. We, too, are called to speak the truth, even in the face of opposition. Reflect on your own life. When have you been called to speak the truth? What was your response to the Spirit’s call? What was the response of those you confronted?

LIVING THE GOSPEL

For those of us who receive the call to prophetic witness with more self-righteousness than humility, our second reading offers gentle correction: “If I have the gift of prophecy...but do not have love, I am nothing.”
