Wisdom 7: 7-11

**REFLECTING ON THE SCRIPTURES**

At various times in history a certain reading of the Bible has given rise to the what is termed the "prosperity gospel". This view teaches that material prosperity is a sign of God's favor and the reward of devotion to God. The author of today's Wisdom reading sees things differently. And the man in Mark's gospel is challenged by Jesus to *give up* his possessions. "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God." Reflect on your own life,. Have there been times when your attachment to some "thing" got in the way of your relationship with God? How did you resolve that dilemma? Share your reflection with a trusted friend.

**LIVING THE GOSPEL**

Our second reading describes the work of God as "sharper than a two edged sword." Today's gospel is a good example of the kind of challenge we find in the scriptures. Deep, reflective reading of the scriptures is not for the faint-hearted. But if you would grow in your relationship with God, do it anyway!

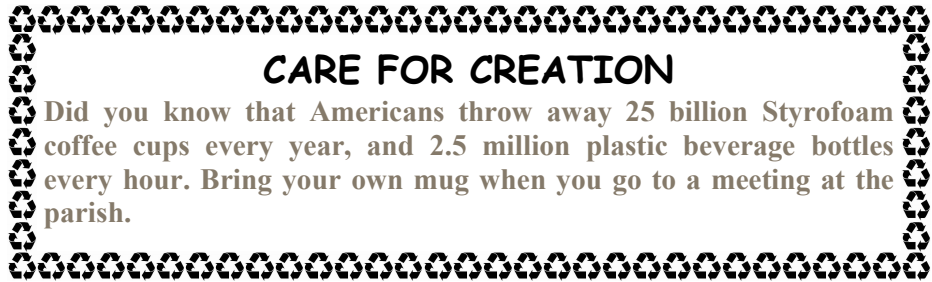
