**MEN'S GROUP: THE POWER OF GRATITUDE - GIVING THANKS**

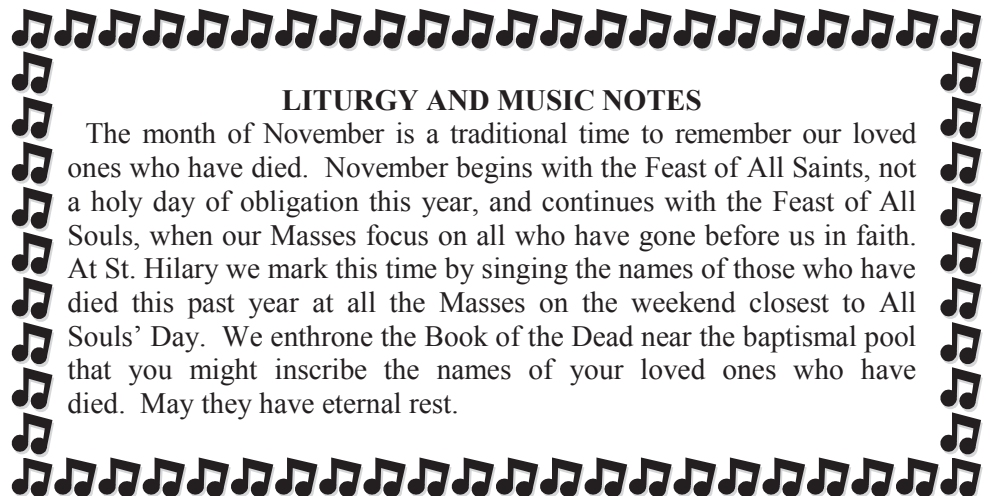

**ST HILARY BLOOD DRIVE**

**MONDAY - NOVEMBER 1 - 1:00—6:00 p.m.**

This year start the season of giving off right by donating blood and giving the gift of life. During the holiday season the need for blood often accelerates, as more surgeries are scheduled and many people are traveling. The blood supply of the Northern Ohio Region of The American Red Cross often drops below minimum inventory standards over the holidays. An average adult has between 8 - 12 pints of blood in their body. If you are at least 17 years of age, weigh a minimum of 110 pounds, and are in good health, you can easily spare a pint. The process includes registration, brief medical screening, blood collection, and refreshments in the canteen. It will take about one hour of your time. Sponsored by St. Hilary Parish nurses. **Reflecting on the Scriptures**

November is a month focused on the “Last Things”. In Catholic-speak that means death, heaven, hell, judgment, afterlife. These readings focus our attention on such somber concerns, yet leave us with hope. The suffering of the Maccabees in the first reading is endured in the certain hope of being raised up to eternal life after death. The dead will rise. God is faithful, St. Paul reminds the Thessalonians in the second reading. In the gospel Jesus answers the “trick” question posed by the Sadducees, a group that did not believe in an afterlife. The next life is nothing like this one, Jesus affirms. The dead will rise.

What is your picture of the afterlife? How does that influence your feeling about death?

**Living the Gospel**

This fall our Catholicism 101 series, “...the resurrection of the body and life everlasting” has treated some of these important topics. Our September presentation, “The Last Things,” and the October presentation, “Anointings, Funerals and Christian burial” were recorded and the DVD’s will soon be available in the parish library. On November 12, Fr. Steve will conclude the series with answers to troubling questions, including those on organ transplantation and end-of-life issues. Feed your faith life with these educational opportunities.

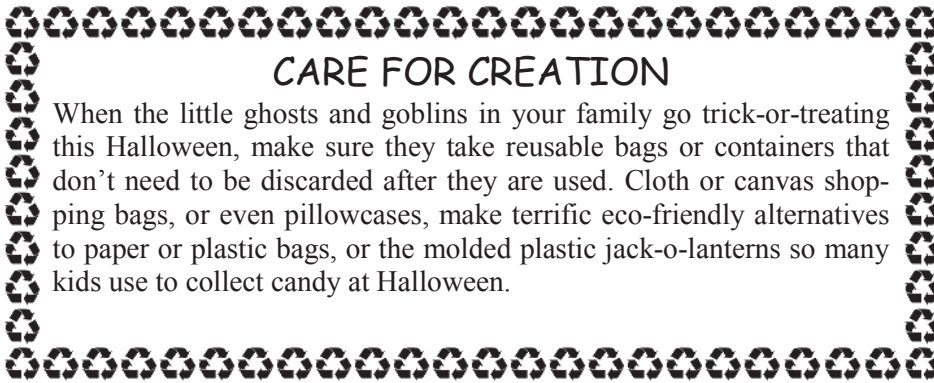
