REFLECTING ON THE SCRIPTURES

Today's first reading from Genesis forms the basis for the reference Jesus gives in the gospel. When God has joined together a man and a woman in marriage the two become one. The church believes that marriage in the Lord is a sacrament, and, like all other sacraments, gives concrete expression to spiritual realities. In the case of marriage, this sacrament reveals something of God's unconditional love, the faithfulness and forgiveness God offers to each of us. Reflect on your own life. What marriages do you know that are such signs? What is it that you see in them? If you yourself are married, are there moments in your own marriage that achieve that sacramental reality? Share your reflection with your spouse.

LIVING THE GOSPEL

Married people realize that marriage is a *vocation*. That's "vocation" with an "o", not "vacation", with an "a"! Being a sign of God's faithful love is a tall order. It requires conscious cooperation with God's grace. And that cooperation takes work. Pray regularly for all the married couples you know.

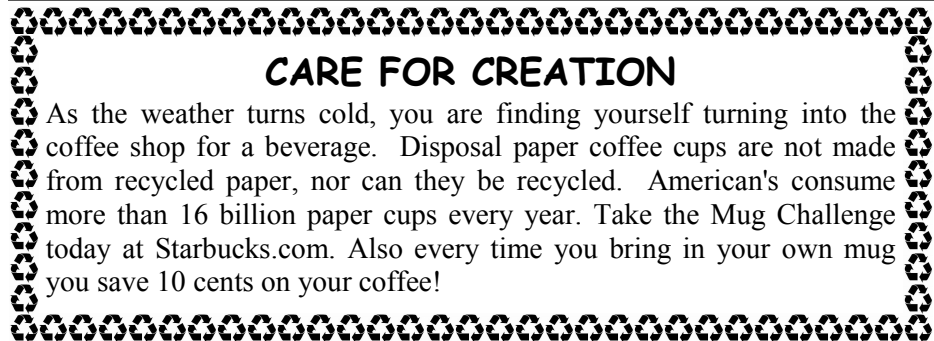
