THE RETURN OF THE PRODIGAL SON BOOK STUDY

On the Road to Reconciliation....a Book Study on *The Return of the Prodigal Son* by Henri Nouwen will be offered in the Gathering Area on four Wednesdays: November 18, December 2, 9 and 16. Joe Mamich, Parochial Vicar of Holy Family Church, Stow will lead the book study which will include prayer, reflection and discussion on a section of the book. There is no cost for participation, but participants will need to purchase the text, available at local retailers (ISBN#0385473079) and read to page 23 before the first night.

LITURGY AND MUSIC NOTES

October 31 & November 1 - The names of those who have died this past year will be sung at all the Masses.

November 7 & 8 - The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be celebrated during our Masses this weekend.

This sacrament is intended for those whose physical or emotional health is "seriously impaired by sickness or old age..." (from Introduction to *Anointing and Care of the Sick*) The word "seriously" (instead of "gravely," "dangerously," or "perilously") was chosen by the official church document when indicating who can receive this sacrament in order to avoid restrictions upon the celebration of the sacrament. "On the one hand, the sacrament may and should be given to anyone whose health is seriously impaired; on the other hand, it may not be given indiscriminately or to any person whose health is not seriously impaired." (from the document, *Anointing and Care of the Sick*)

Those suffering from chronic mental or physical illness, those anticipating surgery or undergoing treatment are certainly encouraged to receive this sacrament.

We will not be receiving from the cup during the flu season.

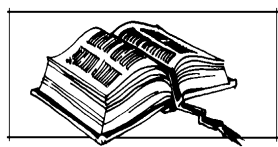

REFLECTING ON THE SCRIPTURES

Today we celebrate All Saints Day, a day on which we remember all the holy men and women who have gone before us and now live with God in glory. How would you describe sanctity? What makes a saint? Would you include miracle-working? Seeing visions? Certainly some saints exhibited those characteristics. But Jesus, in the Sermon on the Mount in today's gospel, included different things as marks of holiness: being poor in spirit, being humble and merciful, having a passion for justice and peace, among others. Reflect on your own life. What elements of holiness do you see in your own life? Don't be shy. After all, you are supposed to be growing in grace. While it is God who makes saints, God doesn't make saints against their will! Where might you cooperate with God's grace more enthusiastically? Share your insights with a trusted friend.

St. Paul referred to all believers as "the saints". Take time to notice and nurture "saintly" behaviors and attitudes among your friends and family members. When you see something that inspires you, say something. Identifying holiness wherever we find it builds up the Body of Christ.

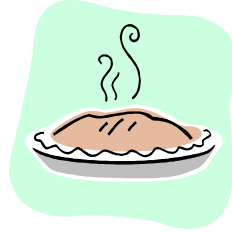

CARE FOR CREATION

Temper the temperature. An easy first step for energy efficient heating is setting the thermostat as low as is comfortable during cool months. The American Society of Heating Engineers recommends 68°F (20°C) when the house is occupied during the day and 60°F (15°C) at night. The Department of Energy estimates that 5 to 15 percent can be saved on energy bills simply by reducing the thermostat by 10-15 degrees for eight hours a day. Programmable thermostats can do this automatically and easily. They are inexpensive, reliable and easy to install.
