**REFLECTING ON THE SCRIPTURES**

We are nearing the end of the liturgical year. Next week, the Feast of Christ the King, is the last Sunday of this year. The following Sunday, the First Sunday of Advent will begin a new church year. Each year, as the current church year draws to a close we reflect on the end of time and the return of Christ in glory. The language the church gives us in today's scriptures is hope-filled and wonderful. "The wise shall shine brightly...shall be like the stars forever" (Daniel) "...He will send out the angels and gather his elect from the four winds. (Mark) "You will show me the path to life, fullness of joys in your presence, the delights at your right hand forever." (Psalm 16) It is a truism of the human condition that everybody wants to go to heaven...but nobody wants to go right now! Reflect on your own life. How do you feel about the end of time, about the end of your time, on the earth? One day will be your last day. If you knew it was going to be tomorrow, how would you live today?

If possible a small box of candy or cookies is a nice way to tape the food gift card on before you wrap it. Tape the pink and purple (colors for Advent) tags securely on top of the package. This tag is the only way we know who is to receive the gift. If the tag is lost, please contact me. Any information is helpful in finding out who the tag is for, such as the name of the child, the clothing/toy, but most of all the number on the top along with the school or agencies.

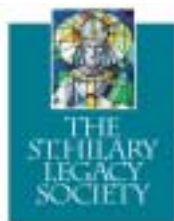
