**Captain Patrick J. Shanahan
Awarded the Bronze Star Medal**

Air Force Captain Patrick J. Shanahan has recently been awarded the Bronze Star Medal for his work in Iraq in 2008. During this period Patrick led a team of 48 airmen in ground combat against the enemy, between May and October of '08. Patrick and his team completed 25 building projects that enhanced the mission readiness of 20,000 soldiers responsible for counter insurgency, reducing overall insurgent violence by 80%.

Captain Shanahan's thorough planning and execution ensured completion of 50 combat logistic patrol missions; traversed over 5,000 miles in dangerous territory. He personally completed 14 site surveys at remote operation bases, contributing to the Multi-National Division North Commander's counter insurgency goals.

Patrick is the son of our parishioner Marge Shanahan. We are so proud of him!
