REFLECTING ON THE SCRIPTURES

Advent is a season of hope. We hear hope in the reading from Baruch who urges the people to look past their current exile to the wondrous return God promised. The gospel reading from Luke gives us John the Baptist's message, "Prepare the way of the Lord...all flesh shall see the salvation of God." 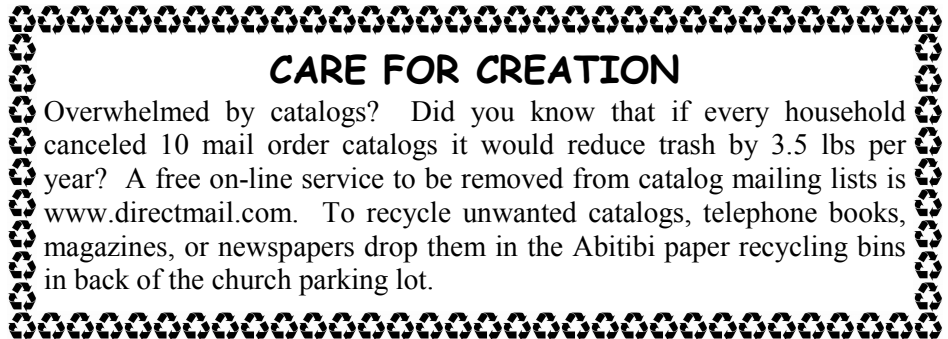
