LENTEN REMINDERS "FAST AND ABSTINENCE"

Ash Wednesday, February 17 and Good Friday, April 2, are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast, that is limited to a single full meal. With regard to Good Friday, the teaching of the Second Vatican Council should be recalled. "Let the paschal fast be kept sacred. Let it be celebrated everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible, prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the Resurrection may be attained with uplifted and clear mind."

The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday. The other Fridays of the season of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. With regard to the obligatory days listed above, however, there is frequent question about the degree of seriousness of the matter. The teaching of the Holy Father may be simply paraphrased: the obligation to do penance is a serious one; the obligation to observe the penitential days specified by the Church is serious. People should seek to do more rather than less. Fast and abstinence on the days prescribed should be considered a minimum response to the Lord's call to penance and conversion.

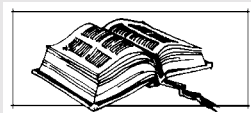
I Cor 15: 12,16-20 Luke 6: 17, 20-26

REFLECTING ON THE SCRIPTURES

Our first reading today draws clear lines between those who trust in God and those who place their trust elsewhere. Likewise, the gospel, Luke's Sermon on the Plain (compare Matthew's Sermon on the Mount) compares those whose attachment is to the things of this world in contrast to those whose ultimate devotion is to the kingdom of God. This is the mark of the true disciple. Material comfort, good times, being thought highly of, while not bad in themselves, must always be secondary to the disciple's primary commitment... the gospel. Reflect on your own life. To what are you deeply attached? Is that part and parcel of your commitment to God or in competition to it?

LIVING THE GOSPEL

"Blessed are you who are poor" can easily be misinterpreted. Being forced to be poor by circumstances beyond your control is not being recommended. What is held up as kingdom living is voluntary poverty; doing with less so that others might have more, charity, detachment from striving for more and more material security, making sure that one's financial resources are put to use doing good. In fact the disciple hears the cry of the poor and responds through works of justice and charity.

SCHOOL NEWS

ST HILARY SCHOOL STUDENTS SERVE MANY NEEDS

St. Hilary School students have been quite busy serving others in recent weeks. In January, students raised over \$1,435 to donate to the American Red Cross Haitian relief efforts. Students in grades 1, 6 and 8 also collected nearly 300 pairs of shoes, clothing, blankets and other much-needed items to send to Haiti. Kindergarteners, first graders and second graders raised money to be sent to Haiti to support the human and canine rescue forces working there. Seventh grade French students wrote letters of encouragement, in French, to students at Sainte Rose of Lima School in Haiti, which was destroyed during the earthquake. In February, the school donated over \$150 to Stewart's Caring Place, from proceeds from the Student Council's sale of strawberry-flavored milk. To accompany the donation, fourth graders made Valentines for patients served by Stewart's Caring Place. Students in grade 7 collected school uniforms, stuffed animals, stickers, and cash donations for children in El Salvador. Sixth graders made placemats for their "buddies" at local nursing homes, with whom they communicate throughout the school year. Students in fifth grade collected sheets and blankets for the homeless in the Akron area who are served by the St. Hilary Parish Social Concerns Committee. Third graders made a special gift to give to St. Hilary second grade students as they prepare for their First Communion. Student Council sponsored a Coats for Kids collection that netted a huge number of child- and adult-sized coats and other winter gear for those served by the St. Hilary Parish Social Concerns Committee. These are just some of the many service projects St. Hilary School students perform during the school year.
