REFLECTING ON THE SCRIPTURES

The Second Sunday of Lent is the Sunday on which we read a version of the Transfiguration of Jesus. Jesus takes Peter, James and John up the mountain to pray and there is transformed, appearing along with the figures of Moses and Elijah, representing the Law and the Prophets. Luke allows us to eavesdrop on the conversation of these three. He tells us they “spoke of his exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem.” “Exodus”? We already have a definition of “exodus”. We understand exodus to be a difficult journey with freedom at the end. Just as the Exodus of Israel led to freedom from slavery in Egypt, so this journey, to Jerusalem, will result in our freedom from sin, as evil is confronted by absolute, forgiving love. Experiences like cancer treatments, rehabilitation, counseling, are difficult journeys with a new found freedom at the end. What have been your “exodus” experiences, when through the grace of God you found new life at the end of suffering?

LIVING THE GOSPEL

During Lent we look toward the renewal of our baptismal promise at Easter to become another Christ. Prayer, fasting and works of justice and charity support us on the way. We change. We grow. We give up what is not worthy of the kingdom of God. The journey is conversion and it can be difficult. But through God’s grace new life and freedom lies at the end.
