EL SALVADOR MISSION 2010

Who should consider a short-term mission trip? We are blessed to be a blessing. "God does not work through a vacuum: He works through real people." In Matthew 5:13-16 Jesus tells us we are the "salt of the earth" and the "light of the world". EVERYONE is called to be a disciple in one way or another:

"Boomers" and "Empty-Nesters" (perhaps ex-hippies and Peace Corps types) are likely to have stopped thinking about children's tuition bills, or acquiring more "stuff" that eventually will fill their garages. They are thinking about how to enrich their lives by helping others. And volunteer vacations, sometimes called voluntourism, fit their desire to make a difference.

Single adults of any age who may not feel comfortable striking off alone for weeks at a time will enjoy the fellowship and adventure of working closely with a group of mission-minded Catholics who will bond as lifelong friends during the trip.

Families with kids: School-age children assist adults with the building of the homes for needy families. They have the opportunity to meet and bond with the local children. They can carry water and tools to adults who may be working on a building site. Their presence on a mission team will open doors and soften hearts. This is a wonderful opportunity for you to bond with your child. No TV, no Gameboy, no phone calls; essentially, nothing to interfere with your time with your child.

REFLECTING ON THE SCRIPTURES

On the Fifth Sunday of Easter the church celebrates the Third Scrutiny with those to be baptized at Easter. Here at St. Hilary we will celebrate that rite at the 11:00 mass and use the cycle A readings which include the story of the raising of Lazarus. Other masses will hear the gospel story of the woman guilty of adultery. Lazarus literally got a new lease on life when Jesus called to him and instructed, "Untie him and let him go." In a similar way, how freed the woman must have felt when she heard Jesus say to her, "Neither do I condemn you, Go, and from now on do not sin any more." The effect of Jesus is always liberating new life. As we near baptism, or for many of us, the renewal of our baptismal promises at Easter, we too, along with our elect, can look forward to new life. Reflect on your own life. What binds you...keeps you from being fully the person God created you to be? What good things have become dead or dormant in you? What keeps you from seeing yourself as the beloved daughter or son of God?
