REFLECTING ON THE SCRIPTURES

Our gospel today begins, "on the evening of that first day of the week." The disciples are gathered behind locked doors. What must have been going through their minds? They had just seen Jesus brutally killed. They "were afraid." Would the future hold the same horrible death for them too? Would they ever see again the one they loved who was so violently taken from them? And how had they behaved during His passion? Were they proud of their reaction? If they had it to do over again...? Into this room, full of fear, anxiety, doubts, self-recrimination comes Jesus. And his first word is "Peace."

Reflect on your own life. Jesus knows that we too have failed sometimes, that we have been afraid, confused, weak. We wanted to do the right thing, but when the time came we couldn't summon the courage. We hadn't wanted to do the wrong thing but gave in to fear and the pressure of the moment. To us he also says, "Peace."

LIVING THE GOSPEL

We've made some changes during Lent. Been kinder, more disciplined. And with the renewal of our Baptismal promises at Easter we've committed ourselves to following the Lord more faithfully. Now, like the disciples we, too are sent. The peace and forgiveness we have been given, we are to pass on.
