REFLECTING ON THE SCRIPTURES

Today's gospel takes us back to the night before Jesus died, when he washed his disciples' feet and, in doing so, modeled the love he commanded of his followers. "As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." His love was not the sentimental touchy-feely emotion that frequently passes for love in our day. But the kind of love that washes the other's foot, that lays down one's life, and that is open to reaching out, like Paul and Barnabas, to the stranger, or in their case, the Gentile. This is a love that is not common, not easy, but possible because of the Lord who "makes all things new." Reflect on your own life. When have you been shown the kind of love of which Jesus speaks in the gospel? When have you been empowered to love so selflessly?

LIVING THE GOSPEL

The kind of polarization so common today in society, even in the church, runs contrary to the mandate to love given by Jesus to his followers. While disagreement is par for the course (even Paul and Peter can testify to that!), respect for the other with whom we disagree is not optional, but mandatory for Christians. Confrontation that is mean-spirited and abusive is not only sinful but frustrates the coming of the kingdom of God on earth.
