REFLECTING ON THE SCRIPTURES

For the Christian it is impossible to read today's first reading without thinking about the feeding of the five thousand as recorded in all four gospels and recounted in today's reading from John. A great crowd assembles. A woefully inadequate food supply is presented. God acts. The peoples' hunger is vanquished.

And for the Catholic it is impossible to read the gospel account of the feeding of the five thousand without thinking about the Eucharist. The language of taking bread, giving thanks and distributing food echoes throughout. Clearly there is more to feeding and hunger than meets the eye in the scripture stories.

Reflect on your own life. What are some of your hungers? Have you presented them to the Lord?
