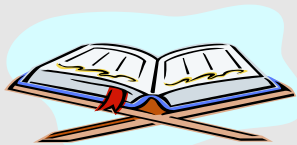

Ready To Donate? St. Hilary's blood drive is just over a week away and we need your help. During the summer months the need for blood often accelerates. Travel and increased activities can lead to serious accidents that may require blood transfusions. The Northern Ohio Region of The American Red Cross is currently below minimum inventory standards of their blood supply. An average adult has between 8-12 pints of blood in their body. If you are at least 17 years of age, weigh a minimum of 110 pounds, and are in good health, you can easily spare a pint. The process includes registration, brief medical screening, blood collection, and refreshments in the canteen. It will take about one hour of your time.
