FR NORM SHOWS HOW FAITH CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE

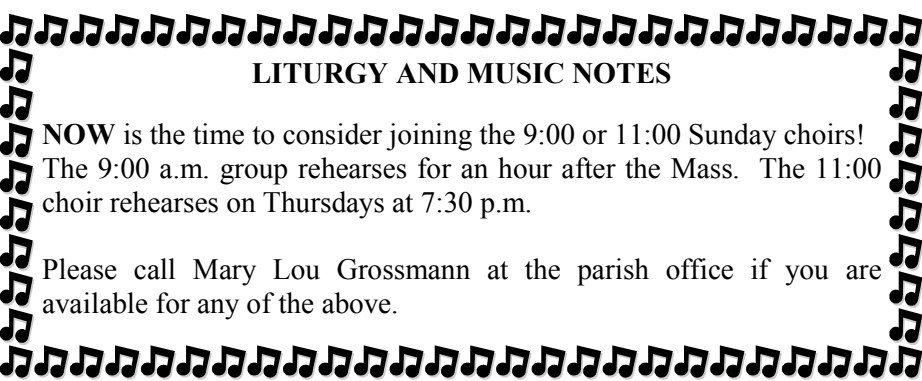

REFLECTING ON THE SCRIPTURES

One cannot read today's scriptures without considering the role of suffering in life. No single interpretation exhausts this great mystery, but a close look at the reading from Isaiah offers some insights. God speaks and we hear. Then we are faced with the choice to follow God's word to us or not. Because of the sin in the world, following God's word will not always be easy. Sometimes, in fact, it will be the cause of suffering... even death, as in today's gospel and the example of Jesus. Suffering, particularly in opposition to evil, is an inevitable part of life, but God is near and has the last word. "Whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it". Reflect on your own life. When have you suffered because you opposed evil? How did you experience the abiding presence of God even in that suffering? Share your reflection with another.

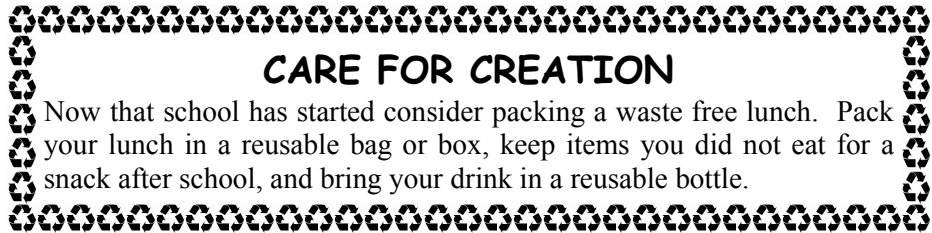

St. Hilary Parish Pastoral Council

August 25, 2009

Dawn Hosick led the opening prayer, "Energies of the Spirit of God", by Joyce Rupp, from "May I Have This Dance". Council then divided into small groups for reflection and discussion. A summary of each group's discussions was shared, and the meeting was called to order at 7:15 p.m.

Present at the meeting were: Fr. Steve Brunovsky, Fr. Joe Warner, Ron Bassak, Chair; Meg Hopp, Vice Chair; Stephanie Sipe, Secretary; Beth Alvord, Jim Bozzelli, Lou Camerato, Scott Dudek, Trish Goodin, Dawn Hosick, Janice Huth, Jeff Lindenberger, Sarah Monasterio, John Randall, Diane Sarkis, Lyn Schott, Martin Sentmanat, and Judi Roman.

Commission Representatives – Fr. Steve reminded Council members to begin contacting the ministry heads within their Commissions and to advise each that they are this year's Council representative/liaison. In addition, he suggested that each ministry head be asked to consider how they can address the Evangelization goals, a copy of which was provided prior to this meeting, within each of their ministries. The following items were then reported on:

Liturgy and Worship – *Meg Hopp, Stephanie Sipe:* Nothing to report.

Caring and Participating – *Jim Bozzelli, Scott Dudek:* Ministries have been divided between Jim and Scott.

Spiritual Formation – *Sarah Monasterio, Janice Huth:* Ministries have been discussed and divided between Sarah and Janice.

Education – *Beth Alvord, Martin Sentmanat:* Nothing to report.

Evangelization - *John Randall, Trish Brennan-Goodin:* John reported on the upcoming sessions, "Awakening Faith, Reconnecting with your Catholic Faith" (September 16 and October 14), and "Come Home for Christmas" (November 11). The "Come and See" Evangelization program will start September 1 at St. Martha Parish.

Social Justice - *Dawn Hosick, Jeff Lindenberger:* Dawn reported on the St. Bernard's hot meal program. There were 38 adult and 8 high school age volunteers. Mark DeFeo contributed cooked chicken; Harvest Bread contributed the fresh bread; Ken Stewart's chef did the cooking; and there were plenty of mashed potatoes/gravy, brownies and watermelon. Trish Goodin organized all donations and volunteers.

Financial Report – Lou Camerato reviewed the financial reports for the fiscal year ending June 30, and highlighted items that have impacted the bottom line. The Pastor's report of finances will be published in the September newsletter. In addition, Lou reviewed correspondence from Bishop Lennon regarding "point of sale" STAR program and new procedures going into effect September 1. Information regarding these changes will be in the bulletin.

Stewardship – Lyn Schott provided an update on the stewardship weekends of October 10-11, 17-18, & 24-25. To date 38 ministries have signed up for the Ministry Fair, and Lyn asked that Council members follow up with their ministry heads regarding participation in the Fair. This year, the stewardship forms were printed in-house. The Ministry Booklet, Parish Directory and the mailing envelope, as well as the postage, will be paid for by advertising and, therefore, produced at no cost to the parish. A St. Hilary parishioner has generously donated funds for the purchase and installation of pew card/pencil holders, and the September newsletter will contain an article about a parishioner who tithes.

Staff Report - *Our Sunday Visitor*, the sole non-profit Catholic envelope provider, has been selected as our supplier. New envelopes will be mailed bi-monthly; individuals who have automatic withdrawal will receive their second collection envelopes quarterly.

Parish Survey - Work on a parish survey will begin once the Staff and Parish Council further discuss and approve the Evangelization Goals.

Fr. Steve requested that members review the primary goals and be prepared to provide input at the next meeting.

School Board – The School Board will meet September 8 and a report will be presented at the September Council meeting.

Pastor's Report – Fr. Steve reported that, regarding Bishop Lennon's letter received this spring concerning our clustering plans, the Cluster Committee is working on a response to include information on each parish's evangelization goals, efforts to increase Sunday Mass attendance, Social Justice Outreach programs being provided, and future plans to support the 17 hospice, nursing, and assisted living residences currently being served by our cluster parishes. Marketing efforts will be increased by providing cluster parish information to a wider group of realtors. St. Victor and Guardian Angels will offer a tuition subsidy for their parishioners' children to attend St. Hilary School.

Fr. Steve also reported that the Knights of Columbus donated their time and supplies to paint the redwood section at the top of the school building.

St. Hilary Foundation – Diane Sarkis provided an update on financial support provided by the Foundation to fund parking lot repairs, roof replacement on the Brothers' house garage, and repairs to the rectory siding and soffit. New Business– Ron Bassak reported on the recent PPC Orientation Training session conducted by Dave DeLambo at St. Hilary and provided copies of the handout materials to those who were not able to attend.

Meg Hopp reported that a statue of Our Lady of Guadalupe had recently been donated to the parish in El Salvador. In addition, it was suggested that first communion outfits which are no longer needed could be donated to the parish in Mizata.
