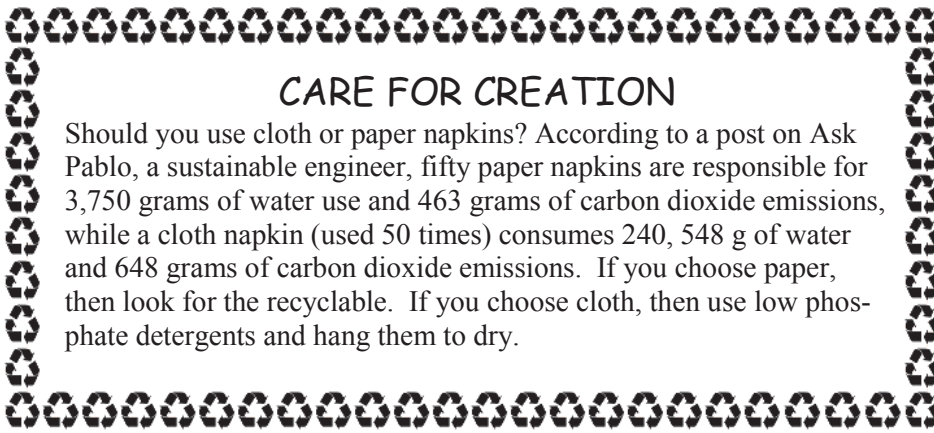

**CARE FOR CREATION**

Should you use cloth or paper napkins? According to a post on Ask Pablo, a sustainable engineer, fifty paper napkins are responsible for 3,750 grams of water use and 463 grams of carbon dioxide emissions, while a cloth napkin (used 50 times) consumes 240, 548 g of water and 648 grams of carbon dioxide emissions. If you choose paper, then look for the recyclable. If you choose cloth, then use low phosphate detergents and hang them to dry.
