REFLECTING ON THE SCRIPTURES

Ancient Christian wisdom warns against "disordered attachments". Our attachment to everything else needs to be properly subordinate to our love of God. In today's readings we see some examples of disorder. In our first reading and gospel, Moses, then Jesus, remind us that the Spirit cannot be limited and that feeling threatened or jealous of another's accomplishments reveals a disordered attachment to one's own power or authority. Your ministry, your position, your talents are to serve the Spirit, not the other way around. Reflect on your own life. Have you know people who "get it"? They allow God to work through them without letting their own ego get in the way? What does that look like? Share your observations with a friend.

LIVING THE GOSPEL

Our reading from James today reveals other attachments that can become disordered...the attachment to wealth, to "treasure". When some grow rich while others are impoverished God is not pleased. Difficult economic times can make us fearful, can cause us to become too attached to what we own. In "Economic Justice for All", U.S. bishops remind us that all economic decisions are moral decisions.

CARE PACKAGES FOR CHRISTMAS

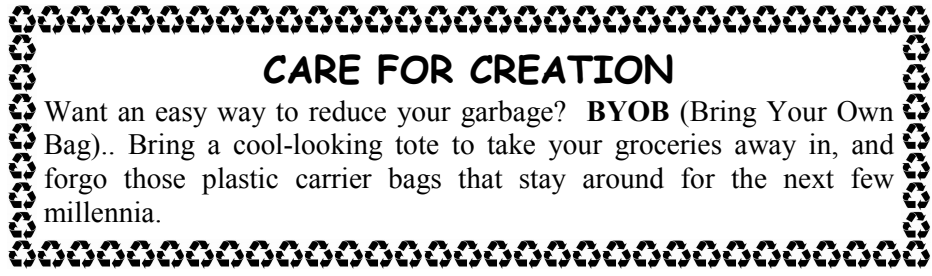

FIFTH GRADERS TAKE LEARNING OUTDOORS

St. Hilary School fifth grade students had an incredible experience last week at the Cuyahoga Valley Environmental Education Center. Students spent four days and three nights at this site located in the heart of the Cuyahoga Valley National Park. They participated in a cross-curricular program that began with science and threaded into social studies, language arts, religion, and other areas. Environmental Education Center staff, St. Hilary teachers and parent chaperones guided the students through a variety of activities that allowed them to explore their surroundings and enrich their education. Students especially enjoyed such activities as learning about the food chain, testing water samples from ponds and the Cuyahoga River, hiking and spotting various types of plants and animals, and sharing friendship around a campfire. Parents agreed that the program affords the students an invaluable experience.

ST HILARY SCHOOL ALUMNI NAMED NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLAR SEMIFINALIST

Two St. Hilary School alumni have been named semifinalists in the annual National Merit Scholarship program. Graham Giles, a student at St. Vincent-St. Mary High School, and Nancy Joyce, a student at Walsh Jesuit High School, were chosen on the basis of their high scores on the Preliminary SAT (PSAT).
